You can read this webpage to find out more about why someone might be taken into care, statistics about young people in care and answers to frequently asked questions.



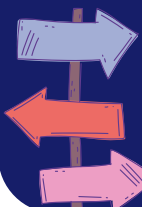

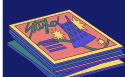
Between 2017-22, the care leaver progression rate into university increased from 12.64% to **14.18%**.
